

Riverside Outfitters Covid-19 protocol for camps

- Touchless temperature checks on all staff and campers will be conducted each morning.
 - If a camper or staff member has a fever over 100° F, they will not be able to attend camp until they are evaluated by a doctor and are cleared (in writing) to return to camp. Siblings or members of the same household will also be unable to attend until cleared by a doctor.
 - Staff and campers are required to stay home if they are sick, have a person in their household who is sick, or have been in contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19
 - Staff will be paid sick leave, and campers will be pro-rated for days missed due to illness. Additional staff will be on-call to fill in if needed
 - If a camper or staff member tests positive for COVID-19, we will begin contact tracing in coordination with appropriate local and state health resources, as warranted, and will contact parents to keep them updated on the situation
- We will encourage personal hygiene among campers and staff
 - Hand cleaning supplies (soap and water or sanitizer) will be available at all times
 - Campers and staff must wash or sanitize hands before and after climbing, before eating, and after using the restroom. More frequent washing/sanitizing is encouraged
 - We will instruct campers and staff to avoid touching their eyes, nose, or mouth
- Cleaning and disinfecting
 - Staff will clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces at least daily (busses, restrooms, door handles, etc)
 - Campers and staff will avoid using shared equipment whenever possible, and equipment will be sanitized between uses whenever possible
- We will maximize physical distance between all persons
 - We will utilize games and activities that don't require close proximity and remind everyone to keep their distance. We will not be able to go rafting since there is no way to maintain physical distance on the raft. We still plan on doing kayak and paddleboard trips for the older groups
 - Groups will be subdivided to fewer than 10 people (total campers and staff) during phase 1 and will be kept separated. Our groups are naturally small, and do not exceed 16 people under regular operations
 - Pickup and drop off locations will be in the park instead of at Riverside Outfitters to eliminate the need to transport kids on the bus. Groups will stay in the same location for the day, or will walk to a nearby part of the park for a different activity. If it is necessary to transport campers on the bus (bathroom emergency, for example), we will ensure that there is 6' of distance between all people on the bus, and staff will wear face coverings
 - Whenever staff are within 6' of another person, they will wear face coverings whenever possible. Exceptions may be made for emergency situation
 - We will keep up to date on CDC, state, and local recommendations and make adjustments to our action plan as needed. We may opt to continue with Phase 1 protocols even after Phase 2 begins if we feel that is the best course of action.
